As I stand before my Alma Mater I can only thank God for the wonderful way in which He has guided, cared and protected me. My mom, Dr. Joy Mathews was one of the early students of CMC, Ludhiana to be trained under the leadership of none other than the Founder, Dr. Edith Mary Brown.

Our class reunion after 25 years of graduation is a time for me to thank God for the miraculous way in which He has led me. This is also my mom's 70^{th} year after graduation!

Viewing my life through a rear view mirror and trying to see as far back as possible, my memories go back to the time when I was a little girl listening to the stories of my mom's life at CMC, Ludhiana, almost a decade before our independence, how she used to travel to Lahore and then to Ludhiana, how dedicated the missionaries were and also the amusing incidents during her college days. These photographs were carefully preserved in my childhood photo album. Though she had told me the names of all her teachers in the photograph, I was too young to understand. All I could gather was that she cherished every moment of her life at CMC. The missionary spirit had got rooted so deeply within her and may be that could be the reason she dedicated more than 15 years of her life after graduation for the service of humanity before even thinking of having a family of her own. But God, who plans our lives even before we are born, gave her a family with three wonderful kids of which I am the youngest. I am thankful to all my classmates who made my college days colorful and happy. The class parties, musical nite, annual play, frenzies, picnics, X'mas parties etc. made life vibranthow could I ever forget that? Now here I am 25 years later, visiting this place which holds a very special place in my heart. My message to the younger generation is "Never give up, never lose hope- God will restore and repay you for the years the locusts have eaten". Alumni Lifetime Service Award 2014 presented to Dr. Mira Shiva

"Dr. Mira Shiva has been selected after due consideration to receive the Annual Alumni Lifetime Service Award of the Christian Medical College, Ludhiana, for outstanding work done in India.

Dr. Mira Shiva belongs to the MBBS Batch of 1968, CMC Ludhiana. She graduated in 1972 and completed MD Medicine in 1978 from CMCL, the year of Alma Ata Charter.

Dr. Mira Shiva has been working on issues related to Rational Use of Drugs and Rational Drug Policy for the past 3 decades, Public Health, Children's Health and Rights, and Women's Health, Reproductive Health and Gender concerns; Women ecology and health, Food sovereignty and Nutritional security, Health rights rooted in Social justice and Gender justice since 1979.

Dr. Mira Shiva is the Founder coordinator of All India Drug Action, constituting of health groups and consumer groups working on Rational Drug Use and Rational Drug Policy. She is one of the founding members of Action for Rational Drug in Asia (PRDA) and former Chairperson of Consumer Education Task Force on Safety of Food and Medicine, Govt. of India. She has worked with the Govt. on various projects as a member of the Task Force on Pharmaceuticals, Regulation of Food and Drugs, Clinical Trials and Banning of Drugs.

Dr. Mira Shiva was appointed by the Supreme Court in a panel of three members to investigate the cholera epidemic of 1998 and also a member of the Monitoring Committee for Drinking Water for the Bhopal Gas Tragedy victims. She is presently a member of Advisory Committee of People Health Movement. She has authored and co-authored several books on Rational selection of drugs and Rational drug policy among others.

Dr. Mira Shiva has been the recipient of several prestigious National and International awards for her work which include the Dr. Olle Hansson Award, The Science and Society National Women Scientists Award and Genova:usa donna fuori dal coro Award. She was honoured by the CMC Ludhiana Alumni Association in North America for contribution in meaningful health work in 2007.

We recognize Dr. Mira Shiva's commitment in providing health care to the people of India. In giving you this award, Dr. Mira Shiva, we take pride, for you have demonstrated to us how 'To serve one another in Love'."

ACADEMIC EVENTS

31st Dr. L.H. Lobo Memorial Oration and CME on Management of Central Nervous System Infections



This year, the 31st Dr. L.H. Lobo Memorial Oration was organized by the department of Neurology on November 16th in the hospital auditorium. The inaugural function and the oration were conducted by Shri Sukhpat Rai Wadehra, President, Dr. L.H. Lobo Memorial Trust and Dr. M.K. Mahajan, Secretary. Padma Bhushan Prof. J.S. Chopra, from Chandigarh was the Guest of Honour.

Professor Gourie Devi, former Director and Vice-Chancellor of National Institute of Mental Health and Neurosciences (NIMHANS), Bangalore delivered the oration. She spoke about the rising burden of neurological diseases such as stroke, epilepsy and traumatic brain injuries. She said that India is now facing the emergence of a "hidden" epidemic: disability due to neurologic diseases.

Prof. Satish Chandra, Director and Vice-Chancellor of NIMHANS, Bangalore gave a talk on the neurological manifestations in HIV patients. Dr. S. Prabhakar, Head of Neurology, PGIMER, Chandigarh, updated the audience on the recent management of Bacterial meningitis. Prof. Mathew Alexander HOD, Dept. of Neurology, CMC Vellore spoke about brain infection following the measles virus.

Total Thoracoscopic Repair of Oesophageal Atresia with Tracheoesophageal Fistula in the Department of Paediatric Surgery



In recent years minimally invasive surgical techniques in children have made substantial progress all over the world and the Department of Paediatric Surgery at CMC Ludhiana is not far behind. Dr. William Bhatti (Professor & Head of Paediatric Surgery) and his team has performed total thoracoscopic repair of TEF in a two days old baby in March 2013–The First of its kind in North India. Since then thoracoscopic repair of TEF, CDH and eventration of diaphragm are being done regularly in the department. They have performed thoracoscopic repair of TEF in a preterm baby weighing 2.4Kg.

21st Annual Conference of Association of Medical Biochemists of India



The Annual National Conference of Association of Medical Biochemists of India (AMBI) was organized by the Dept of Biochemistry from 15th to 17th November 2013 at Hotel Gulmor, Ludhiana. The conference was attended by around

500 delegates from India and abroad. Dr. Graham Beastall, President International Federation of Clinical Chemistry (IFCC) was there to deliver an oration. The conference was preceded by three one day workshops in various upcoming areas of biochemistry including skills to improve medical education.

The 21st Annual conference, being held in Punjab for the first time was inaugurated by Hon'ble Chief Minister of Punjab, S. Parkash Singh Badal on 16th of November and the souvenir and conference booklet were released by Hon'ble Vice Chancellor of Baba Farid University of Health Sciences, Faridkot, Dr. S.S. Gill.

NOGSI Conference



The department of Obstetrics and Gynaecology, Christian Medical College and Hospital, Ludhiana conducted a CME on "Challenges in Obstetrics and Gynaecology Practice" on 30th November 2013 in the Guy Constable Auditorium, CMCH, Ludhiana. This meeting of Obstetrics and Gynaecological Society of Northern India was held under the able guidance of Professor & Head Dr. Sunita Goyal with encouragement and support from the Director of the institution Dr. Abraham G. Thomas. The conference was attended by nearly 100 local practitioners as well as medical fraternity from nearby medical colleges.

Dept of Pathology

The faculty from Pathology department presented 17 posters in the North West Indian Society of Haematology & Blood Transfusion (ISHBT) conference, two of which bagged the first & second prize; titled "Characterization of leukemias using WBC flags and scatter plots generated by Advia-120 automated haematology analyzer" and "Morphological spectrum and role of immunohistochemistry in T-cell Anaplastic Large Cell Lymphoma: A case series of six patients" respectively.


A poster titled "Blastoid mantle cell lymphoma: Immunohistochemical and clinical profile of four cases" was also presented in the first Indian Cancer Congress at New Delhi in November 2013.

Surgical Onco-pathology section has been upgraded with the

introduction of a wide range of immunohistochemical markers. A total of 70 immunohistochemical (IHC) markers have been gradually introduced which include panels for diagnosis and categorization of all malignancies.

The histopathology section is regularly participating in the External Quality Assurance Programme (EQAS) organized by AIIMS, and has always secured good grades.

CMC Introduces Key Hole Spine Surgery



The department of Neurosurgery started key hole spine surgery under the aegis of Dr. Sarvpreet Singh Grewal, Professor and Head, Department of Neurosurgery. The procedure is done using an endoscope or microscope through a small one inch incision in the back and does not involve any muscle or bone cutting. The advantages of the procedure are minimal post operative pain and quick recovery.

CMC is the first in Punjab to start the MCh Neurosurgery programme. So far three candidates have passed out and are rendering much needed Neurosurgical services to the people of Punjab. Dr. Sarvpreet Singh Grewal was felicitated by the Chief Minister of Punjab, S. Prakash Singh Badal at the annual IMA Conference at Ludhiana.

CVS Introduced

Chorionic villus sampling, often referred to as CVS, is a first trimester prenatal diagnostic test for identifying chromosomal abnormalities and other inherited disorders including haemoglobinopathies in the fetus. It is an ultrasound guided invasive procedure which involves removing some chorionic villi from the placenta and subjecting the cells to molecular studies. It is usually performed at 9 to 12 weeks of pregnancy.

Detection of Beta globin gene mutations in fetus at risk of having Beta Thalassemia Major was initiated by ICMR Thalassemia Molecular Genetics Project in 2011, under the leadership of Prof. Sheila Das from the Department of Pathology. After obtaining permission for CVS and Molecular Genetics Diagnosis by the Appropriate District authority as per the PNDT Act, Chorionic Villus Sampling for Molecular Genetic Study has been started in our institution. Dr. Kavita Mandrelle Bhatti (Ob-Gynae) received training for Chorionic Villus Sampling during her Fellowship in Reproductive Medicine at Christian Medical College Vellore and has pioneered CVS in our hospital. Dr. Ranjeet Mashon is our Research Scientist who is skilled for Molecular studies.

Annual Ophthalmic Quiz



The Department of Ophthalmology organized its 10th Annual Ophthalmic quiz and awareness talks for medical students. Among 30 undergraduate MBBS teams, 4 teams had qualified for the quiz following the preliminary round. Dr. Nitin Batra, HOD and Dr. Gurvinder Kaur conducted the finals. Sneha Liz Jacob and Jesse Jacob Skariah and runnerup Jasmine Ratti and Mary from the 2010 batch emerged champions in the quiz. Siddant Shrotriya and Ashikh Thomas presented interesting talks on path-breaking inventions in ophthalmology and community-based rehabilitation.

Cardiology Dept at CMCH Named after Dr. Mary Mathew

In a Programme organized on March 30, 2014, the Cardiology department was named after Dr. Mary Mathew. Director Dr. Abraham G. Thomas said Dr. Mathew spent her life in the service of patients. Dr. Thomas and Dr. Rajneesh Calton, HOD Cardiology were students of Dr. Mathew. The cardiology department has a 15-bedded ICCU unit and is equipped with all latest facilities.

Kidney Month 2014 in CMC, Ludhiana

A kidney month was organized in March, 2014. Activities during the month centered around improving awareness and early detection of kidney disease particularly with an emphasis on the theme "Stop Kidney Injury".

On 8th March a Kidney Health OPD with Nephrology consultation, Diet counseling and Health education was organized in the Nephrology Department attended by patients of kidney disease and their relatives.

On 14th March a poster designing competition on the theme "Ageing and Kidneys" was organized in keeping with the World Kidney Day theme of 2014.

A Renal Quiz was conducted by Dr. Pratish George with 14 teams competing for five slots for the finals which featured eight rounds of "Kidney Gyan". The team comprising Dr. Aprajita Singh, Dr. Amrita and Sumi Susan were declared winners.

On 22nd March a Continuing Medical Education on "Acute Kidney Injury" was held featuring seven talks by eminent national and international faculty, its epidemiology, diagnosis, prevention and importance of early and effective management. 
